Youth Ministry Update

Dear Capleville friends,



It has been a true joy working with the youth. Even in three months of being with you, we have already begun to accomplish some things. In August, we celebrated the beginning of this journey with a trip to the Redbirds game. It was such a valuable experience because we were able to connect with the youth ministries of two other churches from other communities, Crossroads UMC in Collierville, and Calvary Episcopal Church, located downtown. I was introduced to the budding leadership skills of TJ and Gwendolyn as they led the entire stadium in The Wave. At the end of August, we also hosted a School Survival Summit. We had about 20

young people come and share in discussion with community leaders about bullying, social media, and teacher relationships. We enjoyed fun, food, and fellowship with youth from Ross Road Elementary School, Kirby Middle School, and Ridgeway Middle School.



In September, we began youth bible study. Our topic was Mission. We talked about the definition of mission, the Great Commission, Jeremiah and how God uses young people for God's mission, and how to be about God's mission in everyday life, such as opening up to conversation with others about God and being a light for people to see. During the Lock-In that took place Sept. 19-20, each youth was challenged to use his or her own gifts to share Christ with our visitors, not only in our words, but in our attitudes and actions.

In October, we will be preparing for Fall Festival, which will include planning and setting-up, but more importantly, we will be developing our purpose for the Fall Festival. Of course we take for granted that the Fall Festival is to fellowship with one another and provide a safe place for our community on Halloween, but as we continue to flesh out what it means to be on God's mission, my goal for the youth is to be cognizant and intentional about connecting the things that we do with our identity in Christ Jesus.

Beyond the walls of the church, I have been volunteering with Club Hedgerow at Kirby Middle School. I was told by the counselor there that students have expressed excitement that they are seeing me around school and in other places. That means a lot to me because the youth in our community ought to expect our presence. They need to be aware that their growth and development spiritually, educationally, and socially is a community concern.

After three months, I certainly do not feel brand new any more. Hands are to the plow and there is no looking back. Yet we are looking forward to continuing bible study on Wednesdays from 6pm to 8pm, the Fall Festival, serving the community beyond the walls of the church, and whatever else God has in store for us. love and peace audrey


