The story is told of a team of engineers who worked for Thomas Edison in his laboratory in Menlo Park, New Jersey. For many months, they pursued a line of research that ultimately led them nowhere. What had started out so promising turned out to be a blind alley. In fear and trembling, they went in to see the boss, to tell him of their failure.

Edison surprised them all by congratulating

them. True, they had come up with no useful invention, but they had increased the scope of human knowledge. They had eliminated certain possibilities that would, in the future, allow others to direct their own efforts more effectively. Most of all, they had fulfilled their assignment. They had not buried their talent in the ground. They had risked much in a quest for great reward.

The problem with playing it safe is that, all too often, it means not playing at all. The call goes out, in the church, for people to pitch in and help in some way, either financially or by exercising other spiritual gifts. Too often the voice of caution in our heads wins out. "Not me," it says. "I couldn't do that." Or there's the other popular variation: "Not now. Now is not the right time." Always, to these show-stopping objections can be spoken two simple questions: "If not me, who?" and "If not now, when?" *

As we conclude our Stewardship campaign, Six Steps for Generous Living, please consider the commitments you have made to prayer, Bible reading, worship, witness, financial giving and service. We typically consider these as ways that we might pitch in and help the church but these are the ways we trust our generous God with every aspect of our being. These are the activities of faithful discipleship.

Yes, the church needs each of us to pitch in and do our part even if we fail. We cannot fail when we trust God to use us. We cannot fail when we trust God to be with us, to do God's will in us. The only way to fail God is to not try at all, to not grow at all, to bury what has been in vested in us. Our generous God deserves a try from us, so that we may be edified and God glorified!

If not you and me, who? If not now, when?

Public Worship: Because Shelby County remains in Phase 2 of the Back to Business plan and considering that the majority of our congregation is in the high-risk group our leadership team has postponed reopening until the community has been in Phase 3 for at least two weeks.

Sunday School Classes and Small Groups: Our leadership has decided that Sunday School Classes and Small Groups may be permitted to meet at the church in the Great Hall or the gym. Meetings must be scheduled with the church office to avoid conflicts. All participants must commit to hygiene practices, including mask wearing and social distancing, disinfecting the space used (including bathrooms) and returning any tables and chairs to the supply closet after the meeting. You may also choose to have a meeting outside the building with the same precautions taken.

A church member will meet you at your car wearing a mask and gloves to distribute how ever many individual communion elements you need.
